



Phonics Home Learning w/b 01.03.21

This week in Phonics we are learning:

• 2 new digraph phonemes: **ow** and **oi**Digraphs are 2 graphemes (letters) that make 1 phoneme (sound).





• 1 new tricky word: little


Ow and Oi Words




Handwriting practice

Challenge phonics: Write a sentence

Ask your child to have a go at writing a sentence about these two pictures.

Encourage your child to use a capital letter at the start of the sentence, finger spaces in between each word and a full stop at the end.

You can either print this sheet out and ask your child to write on the lines, or you can simply use your device to show the picture to your child and ask him/her to write the sentence on a piece of paper.

- Please do not let your child copy the sentences, they must try to spell the words by themselves.

 The first sentence is: *The owl sat on the tree.*
 - The second sentence is: The coins are in the chest.
