What can George do with his food to save the world?

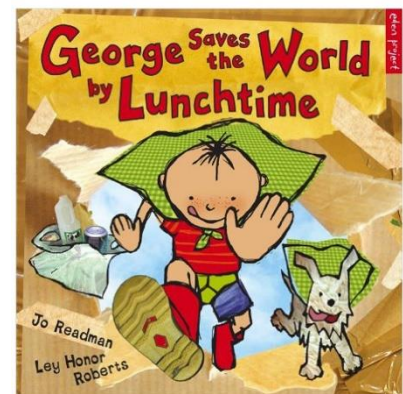
What can George do with the washing to save the world?

What can you do to Save the World!

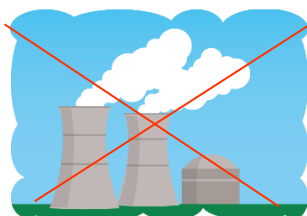
Reduce:

Think about the ways you can reduce the use of water, electricity and transport use.

Turn off the tap when you brush your teeth – this can save 6 litres of water per minute.



Turn off the television and lights when you are not in the room – this will reduce **pollution** which goes into the fresh air we breathe.



Pollution



If you are going on a short trip, why not walk instead of using your car- this will also reduce the pollution going into the air.



Recycle:

Repair:

Do you have broken toys or books in your home or a hole in your clothes? Instead of throwing them in the bin, can you help your adult to fix them?



Reuse:

When we reuse items, we can save on the amount of rubbish that goes to landfill. Look at this enormous pile of rubbish. This is not good for our environment. YUCK! We can save items going to landfill by reusing them.



Upcycling Competition:

Upcycling is a great way to **reuse** waste materials by transforming them into something useful rather than wasteful.

We would like you to have a go at our upcycling competition, creating something using different materials in your home (cardboard boxes, water bottles, bottle lids, kitchen roll holders, milk cartons etc.).
